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Section – A

The plan of action chalked out in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement.

The University administration and the faculty members of the various Departments of Studies and Research are constantly taken steps for the quality enhancement in the administrative activities and academic and research programmes. Views and suggestions of all the stake holders are carefully considered in the process of planning. All the objectives which plays crucial role in quality assurance are also analysed by the University.

The plan of activities of the Departments to achieve the goal are appended below:

Department of Geology

The Department of Geology was started as Madras university P.G extension centre at Govt., Engineering College Campus in the Year 1984. Geology department evolved as one of the pioneer Departments under Periyar University in the year 1997. The department has got full-fledged status from December 2004. Currently the department is offering M.Sc Earth Science, five year integrated programme (from 2008-09) and M.Sc., Applied Geology 2 year programme. The curricula and syllabi for the courses have been periodically updated in line with recent developments in the geological science and taking into account the demands of industry and R&D institutions. The faculty members in the Department have specialized in various disciplines, like Remote Sensing, GIS, Applied Geomorphology, Hydrogeology, Micropaleontology & Stratigraphy, Disaster Mitigation and Management, Sedimentology, Geochemistry, and Coastal zone studies. A center for Geoinformatics and Planetary studies is also carrying out advanced research.

Department of Mathematics

The Department offers programmes of study and research leading to M.Sc., M.Phil, and Ph.D degrees and is on a relentless march towards academic excellence. Planning to introduce a new Integrated M.Sc Programme in Mathematics. With these objectives in mind we want to make our Department a Centre of Excellence in Mathematics.

Department of Commerce

The Department of Commerce, Periyar University has its origin as the Post Graduate Extension Centre of Madras University at Salem for a period of 14 years from December 1983. In the period of 22 years of its existence, the centre and the university have produced 29 Doctorates and more than 100 M.Phil adjudicated. At present 10 M.Phil (full time) scholars have been enrolled for their research programme. The Department of Commerce is offering M.Com and M.Com (C.A), M.Phil and Ph.D. programmes. The Department signed a MOU with BSNL for training Group C and D employees in Behavioural and Attitudinal Changes and so for around 1800 employees were trained. Apart from that the Department intends to collaborate with Consumer Protection Council for developing Consumer Awareness programmes and with Tally Solutions Private Ltd for training and placement for PG Students.

Department of Physics

Department of Physics was established in 2004 with a vision to provide world class research facility and to inculcate the research aptitude among the students and research scholars of this University area. To achieve this vision young and dynamic faculty members of the Department have been geared up to establish laboratories with sophisticated equipments and to carryout research on thrust areas to accelerate of the Department activities. The Department of Physics is offering M.Sc./M.Phil under Choice Based Credit System and Ph.D programme. The Department of Physics signed MOU with Jan Dlugosz University, Czestochowa, Poland. Major research projects to the tune of 2.5 crores are being carried out by the faculty members of the Department funded by UGC, CSIR, DRDO, DST, BRNs etc. Faculty members are publishing papers in the reputed international journals with good impact factors. More than 250 publications published in Elsevier, John Wiley, Springer, AIP, AIC, EJAP publishers.

The faculty members are specialized in various areas of Microbiology like Bioremediation, Bioactive compounds, Enzyme technology, Medical mycology and Biofertilizers. 2. New academic programmes initiated

Proposals to start new academic programmes are placed to the statutory bodies and obtained the approval to start Departments of Botany, Environmental Science and Library and Information Science from 2011-12.

Additional sections of M.C.A. and M.B.A. programmes under self supporting schemes are also initiated.

Center for Women's Studies sponsored by UGC has been launched to address the various problems and issues related to women's in our university area. This center is also geared up to give some training programmes for women's distress.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

The existing academic Departments introduced some new courses and new experiments were designed for laboratory courses. Research based elective courses were introduced in the PG curriculum of Science and Humanities courses.

Five year integrated programme on Visual Communication and Applied Geology were introduced. To enable the Commerce graduates to become eligible for information technology sectors we introduced M.Com. (Computer Applications). Course works for Ph.D. programmes are made mandatory in all the Departments of Studies and Research. Certificate courses in Communication Excellence, Television Journalism, Counselling Psychology and NGO Management for Social Development are introduced for the benefit of students of various Departments.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started

Inter departmental electives are offered in the PG programmes. In addition to that various supportive courses are offered for the non major students of the Science and Humanities Departments.

Recent advancements in Scientific and Statistical softwares have commendously changed the style of research. Accordingly, the Economics, Commerce and Business Management Students were trained in our Computer Center under inter-disciplinary programmes. Environmental Studies and Human Rights papers are introduced as inter-disciplinary courses in all the courses offered in our University Departments.

5. Examination reforms implemented

University Departments are given full autonomy in conducting the examinations and evaluating the students. To meet out the requirements in the Departments to conduct examinations in a smooth manner, a University

Department Examinations wing has been created and a Co ordinator in the rank of Professor is coordinating with the Departments. The provisional declaration of the results is made available to all the students in the Departments on the very next day of the last examination. Any grievances over the provisional declaration of results, the students can represent to the Departments and the grievances will be addressed in a couple of days. The final declaration of results by the Controller of Examinations is made available within fifteen days from the date of last examinations. This examination reform introduced from the academic year 2010-11 for the University Departments has helped the students in a big way for the higher studies in India and abroad.

Conducting the examinations for affiliated colleges is a very big task and involves lot of intricities. In order to expedite the valuation dummy numbers to the scripts are automated. The University administration has also taken steps to introduce automation in the various process involved in the examinations. After getting the node from Finance Committee and Syndicate, full-fledged automation in the Controller of Examinations Office will be introduced from the next academic year.


