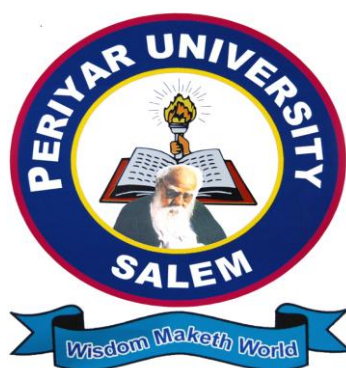

Objective of the Course
