These renewable energy models will promote the use of renewable energy among the stakeholders.

The Department of Computer Science organized a one-day symposium titled "BITBAY 2K21" on 16.11.2021. Delivering the Presidential address Vice Chancellor Prof. R. Jagannathan spoke about the usage of sensors particularly in IoT in today's world and the need for acquiring skills in order that students can get better opportunities during placement. The special guest of the symposium was Mr. S. Srinivas Sivakumar, Chief Digital Advisor at Microsoft and MIT Technology Review Global Panel Member. He elaborated on the latest technology like Industrial IoT, Artificial Intelligence, and Robotics. He also illustrated with an example from Stanford University where people with communicative skills achieve success at a higher rate than people with actual talent. Various events like Paper presentations, Quiz programs, Debugging, Marketing, Meme creation, Trail Making, and Digital brushes were also part of the symposium. It also showcased a Technical Expo where students with different technological



ideas like Smart House with water sensors, Sensor enabled stick for the visually challenged, Persistent vision display, Smart lights with light sensor for cars, Pose Detection by Deep Learning Techniques, COVID Data Visualization, Augmented Reality as a 3D projection of objects, and a 360 Degree view using Virtual Reality of Periyar university campus.

Serving as a resource centre for knowledge and information, the concept of Library aims to develop a comprehensive collection of Books, Journals, Newspapers, Thesis, Back Volumes, E-Resources, CD-ROM etc., for faculty and students of the University and acts efficiently in the dissemination of knowledge. Periyar University Library is a vibrant resource centre

for supporting academics and research communities ensuring the development of a knowledgeable and prosperous society. As the backbone of the knowledge repository, it supports the educational and research programmes by developing collections, facilitating effective use of information resources; providing value-added services to the users; developing Institutional Repositories, building collections based on the user requirements and use cutting edge resources and introducing new technologies.

The University library is named after the great poet Thiruvalluvar who stocked and shared the library of knowledge of aphoristic teachings on virtue (Aram), wealth (Porul) and love (Inbam) not only to Tamils but to the entire world, all in short couplets

The University Library Block is with a built-up area of 1246 sq m. with spacious reading area. The Thiruvalluvar Library has more than 98,482 Volumes of text and reference books on various disciplines; 124 National and International print journals; 13 leading Newspapers; 1541 M.Phil theses; 2715 PhD theses; E-resources through INFLIBNET N –List, DELNET, Springer link, J-Gate Plus, ISID, and Web of Science Database. Accessibility links to world-renowned

academic publishers like Cambridge, Wiley-Blackwell, JSTOR, and Emerald are also available. The library houses provisions for students to refer to IAS, IPS and other competitive exam books for examination preparation besides having more than 4,448 Back Volumes for Ready



Reference Service to the users. The facility of "Open Access System", RFID and Intelligent shelving system (selfissue and self-return) adopted in the Central Library help people to easily source their requirements.

Its services are available from 8.00 A.M. to 7.00 P.M on working days and Saturday from 10.00 A.M. to 5.00 P.M.

One modern adaptation of technology available is Self-Issue - a self-service system, which will let you issue books to yourself whenever the library is open. With a valid Library card, we can borrow items on the Self-Issue machine just by a click and a scan. Another remarkable



facility is the Intelligent Shelf where books automatically are returned when they are placed on the intelligent shelf.

Periyar University Library signed MoU with INFLIBNET Centre for establishing UGC-INFONET Digital library to access E-Resources subscribed in UGC-Infonet Digital library consortium.

University Library has 2781 CDs/DVDs. Steps have been taken to establish CD/DVD Network Server facility to access information available on CDs and DVDs. Further,

steps have been taken to subscribe to Bibliographic databases on various subjects to augment the research programmers.

UGC and INFLIBNET Centres have sanctioned Rs.10.06 Lakhs to establish ETD Lab in the University Library and Digitization of theses and dissertations. All digitized theses are available in the National Repository of Shodhganga as well as our ETD Lab. The ETD Lab has one server with 9 systems. Students can access all the theses free of cost.

Talking Library for Differently Abled Persons has been established in the Periyar University Library exclusively for the Welfare of Differently Abled Persons. It provides access to a variety of web-based resources available for them on the internet. Additionally, it has 180 CDs on talking books, Typing Tutor Software Package and Audio books for differently-abled persons.

Library Services include Circulation Service, Webbased On-line Public Access Catalogue, Information

Alert service, Current awareness service, On-line Access to Databases Services, Photocopying/ Scanning/ Printing



Services, Document Delivery Service, Reference Service, Remote Access, Academic Integrity & Plagiarism, Reference only to Affiliated Colleges, Citation Profile, LMS, and Institutional Repository.

Available facilities are RFID Technology (With Security Gate), KIOSK for self-issue and return of books, CCTV, Institutional Repositories, E-Shodhsindhu Lab, Shodhganga Lab(E-Theses), Digital Talking Book Library (Visually Impaired), Audio-Visual room/Seminar Hall, Wi-Fi Access, Remote Access, Photocopying and Printing, Institutional Membership with DELNET, a Question bank, Heritage Collections, Oxygen Library, DSPACE, and Plagiarism.

Rescuing and re-sheltering earthworms during rainy days

necessary steps through its students to conserve the burrows of earthworms are earthworms on the roadside.

Ever wondered why earthworms are lying on sidewalks and crossing roads during heavy rains? Most of the burrowing species of earthworms come out of their burrows during a heavy downpour but it is not fully understood why they do so though it is known that it is to find a new habitat or a mate as most of the migrating worms are adults. Moving to newer habitats can also bring a chance to find new mates and chances of increasing

Department of Zoology is taking genetic variation within the safely migrate to distant places after population. While raining, the waterlogged and the worms have no other choice but to migrate to the elevated region where water logging is less. Earthworms prefer moist soil rather than wet or dry soil though they can survive in wet soil. The rainy season is a great travel opportunity for these tiny little travelers to move to farther away moist places but they cannot move in dry soil environments. Hence, the Department of Zoology is planning to educate the public not to trample earthworms and allow them to

heavy rains. With this noble vision to protect and preserve the lives of the farmers' friends, the Department of Zoology is taking necessary steps through its students to conserve the earthworms on the roadside. The simple approach they suggest is to pick them up and safely release them on the moist soil where water stagnation is low. Thus, students are alerted during times of continuous rain to safe-guard the worms and other creatures in order to enable them escape from the effect of natural calamities.

Zoology endorses the development of technology to treat and convert organic wastes, agricultural wastes, agricultural wastes, and industrial wastes into nutrient-rich compost using earthworms. The workshop highlighted the significance of earthworm for

prevention of soil pollution worldwide. In his inaugural address, the Vice chancellor emphasized that the long-term goal of this vermi compost unit is to increase campus

sustainability through the effective management of organic wastes. He also stressed to do research on microbial activity during the vermin composting process.
