Ladies and gentleman, on behalf of Periyar University, I extend a warm welcome to everyone on the occasion of this 20th Convocation.

It is my immense pleasure to welcome our Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu and Pro Chancellor of our University, Dr.K. Ponmudi. He has obtained his Bachelor's Degree in Law, Master's Degree in three different subjects namely History, Political Science and Public Administration and Doctorate Degree in Political Science from Annamalai University.

He started his career as a Professor in the Government Arts College, Villupuram and later turned out to be a successful politician. He has been elected to the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly six times. He represented Villupuram assembly constituency four times and Thirukkoyilur assembly constituency two times. He served in the Tamil Nadu Ministry three times in different portfolios viz Health, Transport & Highways and Higher Education in the past. At present, he is serving in the Tamil Nadu Ministry as the Minister for Higher Education, Science and Technology.

During his tenure, I am happy to state that the Government has started many Government Colleges of Arts and Science and sanctioned many new UG



/PG programmes in the Government Colleges. During the Covid-19 pandemic situation, the Government graciously considered the representations and granted permission for 25 % additional seats in Government Colleges which helped the poor students to get admission in Government Colleges with minimum fees. On behalf of every one I welcome our Pro-Chancellor.

I am extremely happy to welcome our Chief Guest Prof. Govindan Rangarajan, Director of Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. He has obtained his M.Sc (Hons) degree from the Birla Institute of Technology and Science (BITS), Pilani and Ph.D. from the University of Maryland, USA. After having served in the Lawrence Berkley Lab, University of California, he joined in the Department of Mathematics, Indian Institute of Science in 1992 and continues his service in IISC in various capacities.

He is a fellow of 2 National Scientific Academies, out of 3, namely Indian Academy of Sciences and the National Academy of Sciences, India. For his outstanding contribution in Research, he was awarded the Knight of the Order of Academic Palms (Chevalier dans l'Ordre des Palmes Academiques) by the Government of France. He was also a Homi Bhabha Fellow and a JC Bose National Fellow.

He was instrumental for many mathematics initiatives like inter-continental satellite courses for Indian and French

students. Instructional Schools and Workshops in cutting-edge areas, Interdisciplinary Ph.D. programmes in Mathematical Sciences. Further, he served as head of the Indo-US Virtual Institute for Mathematical and Statistical Sciences which was jointly established by the National Science Foundation, USA and the Indo-US Science and Technology Forum. Currently, he is the Director of the Indo-French Centre for Applied Mathematics, a joint venture between the DST, India and a consortium of French Institutions which supports many collaborative research projects in the broad area of Applied Mathematics.

He also served as the Chairman of the Mathematics Department, Convenor of Digital Information Services Centre, Chairman of International Relations Cell, Chairman of Interdisciplinary Research Division, Head of IISc's fundraising and Alumni Affairs committee. At this juncture, I feel delighted to mention that many of his colleagues (Prof. Venimadhavan, Prof. Thangavel, Prof. Nandhakumaran, Prof. Sunil Chandran, Dr. Venkatesh) have visited the departments of Periyar University on many occasions and have delivered invited lectures, chaired sessions, served as advisory committee member of SAP etc. I hope that the interpersonal relationship between IISc and Periyar University will continue in future by ways of MoU's to solve some problems of common interest.

I extend my warm welcome to Dr. D. Karthikeyan, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu. He started his career as Professor in Government College and later turned out to be an IAS officer. He is a very active administrator and his suggestions in various matters helps Periyar University to reach new heights in academics.

Activities at a Glance New Initiatives

I am very proud to share with this august gathering that Periyar University has bagged 4th rank in ARIIA and 73rd rank in NIRF-2020 by MHRD and is continuously placed within 100 ranks in the past 4 years.

The Boards of Studies for the University Departments get revamped by including student representatives and the revised OBE curriculum have been implemented in affiliated colleges and University Departments.

Internship training has been made mandatory for all the programmes (UG & PG) offered in the University Departments and Affiliated colleges to provide better exposure to the market trends and job opportunities to the students in accordance with the UGC guidelines.

Almost all our transactions and other process like submission of applications for admissions, examinations, affiliation of programmes, entrance examinations for admission, payment of fees etc. are automated.

The MoU signed between Periyar University and NCC Directorate for offering PG Diploma in Management and MBA programme to the in-service officers in the NCC Directorate is the first of its kind among the Universities in Tamil Nadu.



Six new programmes have been introduced in the University Departments, namely M.Sc. Data Science, M.Sc. Environmental Science (5 year integrated programme), M.B.A. Export and Import Management, M.B.A. Hotel and Tourism Management, B.Voc. Digital Marketing, D.Voc. Accounting and Taxation.

The MBA programme offered by the Department of Management Studies and M.Tech. programme offered by the Department of Energy Science and Technology are approved by AICTE from 2020-2021 onwards.

Bamboo based Oxygen park, Medicinal plants park, and Vermi Compost production unit for waste management system have been established for giving better environment to the future generation.

PITCH-Pre Incubation Training centre for higher Educational Institutions, a flagship initiative of Periyar University Business Incubation Confederation focusing one million ideas initiative of Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII)-TN was launched in 2021 by the Hon'ble Mrs. P. Geetha Jeevan, Minister for Social Welfare and Women Empowerment, Govt. of TN.

Startups of BIC@PU has been recognized with Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) certification from Startup India under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, one of the brain child projects of our Hon'ble Prime Minister working vigorously for the Independent sustainability of our country.

Academic & Research Activities

Faculty members of 27 University departments (and PG Extension Centre) have been actively involved in carrying out UGC, DST, DBT, ICMR, ICSSR, MOEF&CC, MOFPI, TANSCHE and TNSCST funded projects worth ₹ 12.67 Crores. There are 912 research papers published in peer reviewed journals including chapters in books and we obtained two patents. The department faculties have organized 71 Conferences, Workshops, Seminars and 65 skill oriented training programmes. Even during the Covid-19 pandemic, our faculty members have presented papers / delivered lectures in 53 online webinar's conferences / workshops / seminars at National and International level. Our faculties Prof. S.Anbalagan, Centre for Geo Informatics, Prof. R.Balagurunathan, Dept. of Microbiology have been awarded TANSA Award by the Govt. of Tamil Nadu in recognition of their outstanding contribution in Research. Prof. R.Balagurunathan, Department of Microbiology has been selected for MHRD - LEAP training at Harvard University U.S.A. Apart from the above, our faculty members bagged 29 awards for their contributions.

Periyar University is celebrating its Silver Jubilee, i.e its 25th year of existence combined with the celebration of the 75th year of Independence of our Country and planned to conduct at least 75 academic programmes. Prof. D. Gopi has emerged into the global list of the top 2% of scientists by the data compiled by Stanford University. Dr. Mu. Ramkumar and his team discovered the antiquity of Vaigai Civilization to be about 7500 years contrary to the widely known limits of less than 3500 years.



Periyar University has released ₹ 1.12 crores to research scholars towards research fellowships apart from the fellowships received from Government Agencies.

Infrastructure

All the 27 departments are facilitated with Computer centres and internet facilities for the betterment of the students and researchers. ₹ 41.5 Crores were spent for the establishment of New buildings, additional floors to enhance the infrastructure facilities. Ramanujam Computer Lab has been established in the Department of Mathematics with 60 computers and a high configuration server worth ₹ 50 lakhs from DST-FIST. The Business Incubation Centre at Periyar University (BIC@PU) has been upgraded with new equipment worth Rs. 70 lakhs from the grant sanctioned and released by the Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Institution of Govt. of Tamil Nadu and the same was inaugurated by the Hon'ble MPMr. S. R. Parthiban.

Affiliated Colleges

At present there are 115 colleges affiliated to Periyar University. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, online Faculty



Development Programmes for college teachers have been organized in Computer Science, Mathematics, English, Microbiology, Textiles & Apparel Design and Management Studies.

Towards motivating the teachers, and researchers in the affiliated colleges, 2 Best Teachers (1 for Science and 1 for Arts), and 2 Best Researchers (1 from Arts and 1 from Science) award have been instituted and conferred to teachers. This awards carries Rs. 10,000/- cash prize and a citation.

Service to the Society

The NSS Cell of Periyar University has actively conducted Fit India Freedom Run 2.0, Clean India Campaign, Pre-Republic Day Camp, Blood Donation Camps, Covid Vaccination Camps, Awareness Camps on Covid Pandemic and Diabetics. More than 500 members have benefited from such programmes. Nine students participated in the South Zone Pre-Republic Day Camp held at University of Agricultural Sciences, Bengaluru. A week long

residential camps were organised in Naranampalayam and Kottagoundampatti villages. Humanitarian week festival and World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims were also conducted.

Library

Library automation has been our priority and around ₹ 8.5 lakhs has been spent for

upgrading the library with new facilities Women's Studies Centre like intelligent shelf for self returning of books, Kiosk for self issue of books, Egate software for library user entry and Software for automatic information through e-mail/SMS etc.

In addition to the existing 98,482 volumes of books, magazines, periodicals, 2125 new volumes have been added to support the recent developments and newly designed curriculum. We are also constantly uploading our Ph.D. thesis in the national repository Shodhganga.

Physical Education

The Physical Education department has conducted 32 tournaments during for men and women and have also conducted a one week Faculty Development Programme. The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has sanctioned ₹ 7 crores to establish a Synthetic Athletic Track in our campus. We have received ₹ 3 crore as the first installment grant.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell of Periyar University has conducted Various Campus drives at regular intervals for job placements and more than 1035 students have been placed in Banking and IT enabled services. Further our faculty members are also trained by Companies through the placement cell.

The Women's Studies Centre is effectively functioning with the financial support of UGC. The Centre has established a day care centre to take care of the children of the staff. This centre also takes care of Women welfare and gender issues.

Periyar Institute of Distance Education (PRIDE)

PRIDE is revamped and the admissions and payment of fees are made online. Perivar University has launched the Online Degree Programs from Jan 2021 batch and offers 2 Bachelor Programs for English, and Commerce and 5 Master programs in Business Administration, Mathematics, Commerce, English and History.

Extension Activities

SET/NET/UPSC Free coaching is provided to the students through departments and large number of students cleared NET/SET examinations. The University is offering free training 2020-2021 at the inter collegiate level and coaching to the students aspiring to take up various competitive examinations like the UPSC, TNPSC, and other recruitment examinations for employment.

Gold Medalists and Ph.D. Awardees

A total of 771 candidates are to be awarded University Rank Medals and Ph.D. in the year 2019-2020 and 2020-2021.

The outbreak of the pandemic Corona/ Covid 19 has highlighted the importance of digital literacy to us and reassured us that lockdowns can never keep us away from the learning environment. Digital literacy means understanding technology and using it appropriately. To overcome the challenges of the 21st century, Universities that are seats of higher education, should ensure that their students are able to bridge the digital divide. Establishing virtual labs would also help students and teachers avail the various tools for learning, including additional web resources, videolectures, animated demonstrations and self-evaluation.

With the rise of mobile networks, social media, and internet of things, an explosion of big data is already a reality. Hence, data science is increasingly playing a critical role as a research

tool. It is therefore important that students of the future are well-trained in this important area. Periyar University can introduce a basic data science course for all disciplines.

Another important consideration for universities is promoting gender equity. Researchers should develop tools to make the educational system sensitive to gender inequality, innovate gender — sensitive pedagogies, thus eliminating gender bias. A society attains better development in all aspects when both the genders are entitled to similar opportunities.

The uniqueness of our country lies in its plurality of culture. India is home to one of the world's largest collections of songs, music, theatre, folk traditions and rituals and for many tribal clans, art and craft are a source of income. We may settle in different parts of the world, but we should be rooted in our culture, and education plays a vital role in introducing the culture of the society among students. Knowledge and stories of our traditional community would help students become educated adults, proud of their heritage. Selfworth and pride contribute a lot to the confidence of students and their development. Hence it is the duty of every institution to transmit its cultural heritage among its students.

The pandemic has taught us a great lesson during the recent times that 'Health is Wealth'. There is a famous saying- 'If wealth is lost, nothing is lost, if health is lost, everything is lost'. Periyar University accorded all India second position in NAAC accreditation



Periyar University Salem has bagged the second place with A++ in the all India ranking of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council), with a score of 3.61. Periyar University has secured the first place in the state and the second place at the national level among the state government universities.

This is the first time that Periyar University has achieved the top coveted position.

The NAAC Peer team visited the University campus between 22nd and 24th of this month for physical inspection to look into Research, Extension and outreach activities, Infrastructure facilities, and the academic related processes.

The physical inspection conducted once in five years looks into the design and development of the curriculum, teaching learning, student progression, evaluation methodology, assessment, development of leadership qualities entrepreneurship ventures, and such other parameters that will aid and support germination of innovative ideas for national development.

By raising the overall standards in the academia, Periyar University has risen itself to secure all India second rank and first in the state among government state universities.

The following is the component wise breakup of the achievement of 3.61 out of the possible 4 in the

CGPA. Curricular aspects 3.6; Teaching-Learning and Evaluation 3.76; Research, Innovation and Extension 3.72; Infrastructure and Learning Resources 3.7; Governance, Leadership and Management 3.33; Institutional values and Best practices 3.96.

The ranking will give a fillip to the activities organized and conducted in the university campus and be a morale booster to secure funding from external agencies and government organizations especially to continue and conduct research activities in frontier areas with more scope for visibility and credibility of the proposals. The Vice Chancellor hopes that the good work will continue and take the University to the next level of achieving international recognition.

Prof.R.Jagannathan Vice Chancellor showered praises on all those who tirelessly worked for hours on end to achieve this distinction. Especially the Members of Syndicate and Senate, Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Deans, Director IQAC, Faculty members, Non teaching staff and members of the public, and the students and research scholars of the University departments.
