Former Vice Chancellor of Manonmaniam University Prof. R. T. Sabapathy Mohan spoke as the special guest on the occasion and excerpts from his speech:

Periyar's principles will stand till the last Tamil remains in this land. Universities should celebrate the birthdays of all the leaders like Ambedkar and Kamaraj so that the younger generation could know all the leaders and the principles they crusaded for. Arignar Anna was the only leader who was called Anna with relationship affection. We have long cherished language identity and temporal identity that dates back to more than 2 thousand years. Anna became the symbol of Tamil along with these three. We cannot limit his unlimited talents within the picture of orator.

A rare man, the pinnacle of humanity, a political genius, there is no one as educated as Anna. He was the pinnacle of knowledge. Anna started not only a political movement but also a cultural movement. He created modern Tamil Nadu by using two weapons, Pen and Speech. Anna met tens of thousands of youth throughout his life and continued to address them for their progress.

# Tamil Nadu stands tall as it was the first state to democratize Education



Dr. J. Jeyaranjan, the Vice Chairman of State Planning Commission (SPC), said that Tamil Nadu is a leading state because of democratization of education and implementation of various schemes. On behalf of the Kalaingar Research Centre operating in Periyar University, the Muthamizharingar Kalaingar Special Talk was held on 16.09.2022. Prof. R. Balagurunathan, Registrar (FAC) of Periyar University, welcomed the gathering.

The excerpts from the Vice Chancellor's speech who presided over the function: Kalingar was a multitalented genius having commanding political and literary skills. He implemented social reforms through his political platform and fulfilled the needs of the people who brought many social security schemes like Food grain production increased with the introduction of the Land Reform Act. During his tenures Industrial sector attracted more investments and factories; he announced and implemented free education for all. By creating hundreds of farmers' markets (Uzhavar Sandai) he saw that the farmers' produce got a fair price. By creating Tidal Parks he laid the foundation for the IT revolution in Tamil Nadu.

Excerpts from Dr. J. Jeyaranjan's speech: We need to compare how Tamil Nadu was hundreds of years ago and how it is now. There are much and variety of data from village to village. Until the 1950s, the feudal system determined hunger and starvation. Common people were able to operate depending on those who owned the land. Even after independence the industrial sector remained small and as a large number of people did not get employment through this, poverty persisted. Getting a job just for 120 days a year was a big deal. There was a time when caste structure, poverty, unemployment etc. were huge.

We got freedom at a time when there was neither social freedom nor economic freedom. The standard of living of the people should be improved only by creating employment. Creating it as per population remains the biggest challenge even today. Bringing about social change will bring about economic change. Most of the government programs are based on two things - food and education. Although the target was achieved in food grain production, the planning to reach the public was not better and so the then Chief Minister Kalaingar extended the ration card system that was catering only to Chennai and Coimbatore.





Everyone should come and join in education. Education should be democratized. To encourage this, programs such as Mid-Day Meal Scheme and Breakfast Scheme are being implemented. Creating a dynamically operating Transportation system is also a part of this. Tamil Nadu is today a pioneer state due to various works done in 1970.

Tamil Nadu ranks first, making Maharashtra in terms of industrial development. Tamil Nadu became a developed state only because of democratization of education. There is still a long way to go. We have achieved in numbers. But the quality behind the numbers remains questionable.

There is a need to take giant leaps. We need education and the quality of education needs to rise. A leap of 5 times growth and 10 times growth will happen only if the curriculum is changed according to the recent needs.

Major programs have been implemented in primary education. Universities should come forward to increase the quality of higher education and student enrollments. Kalaingar M. Karunanidhi has already laid the foundation of this great work. A great duty awaits us.

Active University Chairs, such as Kalaingar Research Centre in Periyar University, in developed countries, ensure growth. 6 professors from Vienna in Austria together developed this concept of Chairs in universities. It was those Chairs they created that enhanced the plans and policies. All development work like preparing research students, creating discussions about it in the community is made possible by the activities of research chairs.
