## Alumni's Feedback Analysis: Action Taken Report

- Alumni have requested a career- and skill-related curriculum.
- Some of the alumni have asked for improvements in hostel facilities and medical care.
- The alumni have recommended increasing the level of placement and training, and they are also expected to have adequate skills to attain competency.
- Advanced techniques in teaching are expected by the alumni.
- A few alumni requested placement training so that it could bridge the gap between industry and academia.
- Some pupils suggested spacious and hygienic canteens, and the availability of internet facilities on the campus.
