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ANALYSIS OF STUDENTS SATISFACTION SURVEY (SSS) ON TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS


Perception of students about Teaching – Learning and Evaluation was conducted in order to improve the quality of this process in our university through Student Satisfaction Survey. The survey was conducted with the help of Google form which comprises of twenty (20) objective type questions and one (01) qualitative question related to overall teaching – learning experience in our university as ranking system (1 to 5) as per the guidelines provided by the NAAC which was given below and it was circulated among all the students through E-mail.


Highest positive response is rank as 5 and the lowest negative response is ranked as 1. Students were responded to all the questions provided in the Google form


Graphical representation of student feedback about the SSS questions




About 57.40% of students participated in this survey revealed that, 85 to 100% of syllabus was covered in the class while 33.5% of students answered that 70 to 84% of syllabus was covered in the class. Similarly, 7.3% of students were expressed that, 55-69% of syllabus was covered during the class room teaching and very little percentage of students were articulated the limited portion of syllabus was covered.




About 45.30% of students think teachers were prepared for the class thoroughly. But, 51.10% of students think teachers were prepared for the class satisfactorily. Only 3.6% of students think that, teachers do not prepare very well for the class.




Always effective ratings were given by 60.50% of students while 29.70% of students thinks teachers communicate sometimes. Just satisfactorily ratings were given by 7.70% of students.




Teacher's approach to teaching was described as excellent by 44.90% of students, whereas students of 36.30% and 16.30% described teacher's approach to teaching as very good as well as good.




About 50.10% of students find the internal evaluation process by the teachers as always fair and 38.20% of students found it usually fair. Only 9.50% of students find the internal evaluation process by the teachers as sometimes unfair.




About 50.40% of students approved that, their performance in assignments were discussed every time and 36.60% of students think their performance in assignments were discussed usually. Only 9.40% of students voted their performance in assignments were discussed occasionally or sometimes.




Most of the students (55.90%) students approved that institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for them regularly while 27.50% of them opted for often. 12.50% of students stated that, internship was promoted sometimes in the institute.




Half of the students (41.10%) participated in this survey were approved that, teaching and mentoring process in their institution facilitates them in cognitive, social and emotional growth significantly while 42.50% of students thinks that it is very well. Only 13.50% were think it was done moderately.






Most of the students (49.60%) agreed that, teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes every time and 39.40% of said that it happens usually. About 8.20% of students think that teachers inform that occasionally or sometimes.




About 49.60% of students felt that, their mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task with them every time while 38.10% of students felt that follow up happens usually. Occasional follow up was observed by 8.70% of students.




About 52.20% of students were agreed that, illustration of the concepts done by the teachers through examples and applications and 37.30% was agreed that it was happens usually. Only 8.20% of students think that illustration was happened occasionally or sometimes.




Most of the students (50.20%) were agreed hat, teachers were identified their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges reasonably and 35.10% were it was identified slightly. About 9.80% and 3.40% were agreed fully and partially. Only 1.50% were thinks unable to identify their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges



Majority of the students (47.10%) were thinks that, teachers were able to identify their weakness and help them to overcome that every time while 33.50% were agreed it happens usually. Very few students (12.30%) agreed it was happened occasionally or some time.




About 45.60% of students agreed the institution made effort to engage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process whereas 40.70% of students were strongly agreed. About 10.90% of students were opted neutral.




About 48.10% of students think the institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning


experiences to a great extent level and 39.20% of them were agreed moderately it was used. Only 9.30% of them were it opted in some what level.




Around 48.20% of students were strongly agreed that, they have received encouragement from teachers to participate in extracurricular activities while 37.30% were agreed that. Only 10.20% of them were opted for neutral.



More than half of the students (48.70%) participated in this survey agreed that, moderate level efforts were made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work. Very little efforts were observed by 38.60% and 8.40% of them were opted for to a great extent level. Only few students (3.20%) were observed no efforts were made for them to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work.



About 51.70% of students were agreed that most of the teachers used ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia for teaching and 35.40% of them were opted for 70-89% of teachers used that while teaching. Only 9.60% of students were rated as 50-69%.



Most of the students (50.80%) were agreed that, overall quality of teaching-learning process in their institute is very good while 39.10% of them were strongly agreed that. About 7.60% of students were opted for neutral.
