










### Awareness week on 'Police Akka' initiative




## WSC holds webinar on violence against women


Student R. Deepika proposing vote of thanks reiterated that renowned poet like Bharathiyar is very much relevant in today's context.

It was an attempt to enable students in understanding the application of mathematical theories in real world.

The event begun with the Department Head, Prof. C. Chandrasekar, giving a lowdown on department's contributions in promoting advanced learning opportunities. He stressed the pivotal role of mathematics in digital image processing and explained how Fourier Analysis are fundamental in transforming, analysing, and enhancing digital images, thereby propelling innovations in fields like medical imaging, computer vision, and Artificial Intelligence.

Prof. H. Hannah Inbarani presenting the theme of program, emphasized the importance of Fourier Analysis in solving complex mathematical and engineering problems and its applications across various domains.

In his presidential address, Prof. A. Sathish Kumar, IIT, Chennai, exemplified the role of approximation techniques and FA in shaping modern computational and scientific advancements. He further elaborated as how one can leverage these concepts in developing impactful solutions. He also spoke on decomposition of functions, Fourier transforms, and their significance in solving differential equations, and signal processing.





The speaker further elaborated on how Fourier transforms enable the representation of speech signals in the frequency domain, making it possible to analyse, filter, and synthesize signals with precision.
