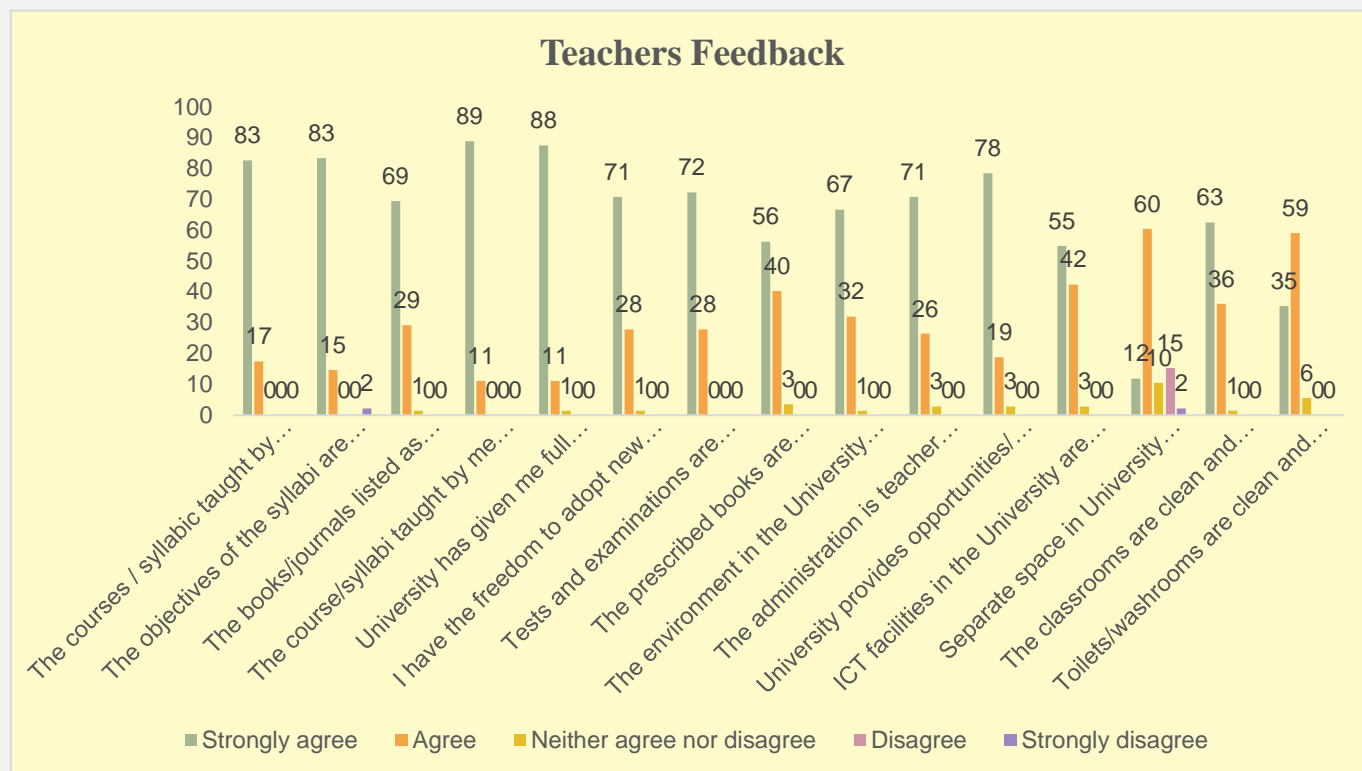

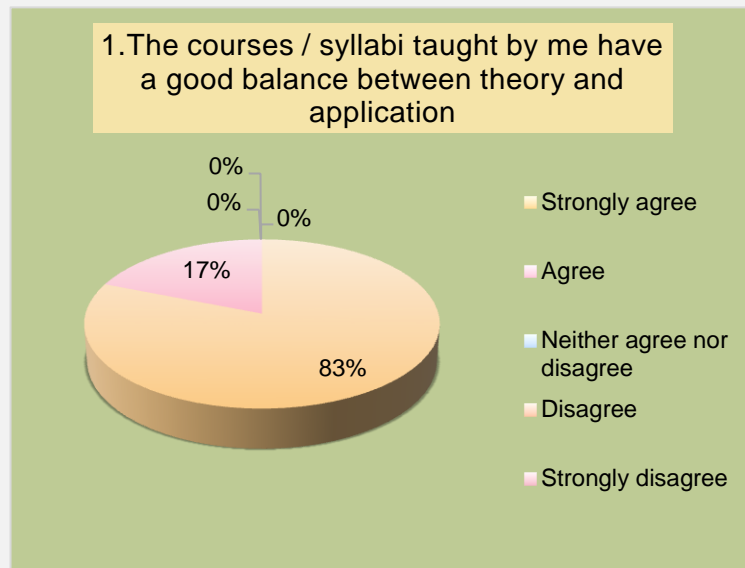

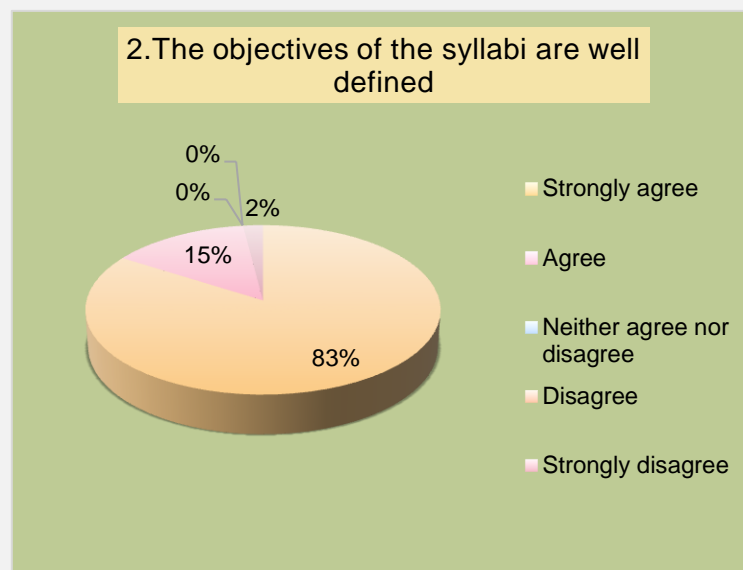

### C.Graphical representation of Teachers feedback:

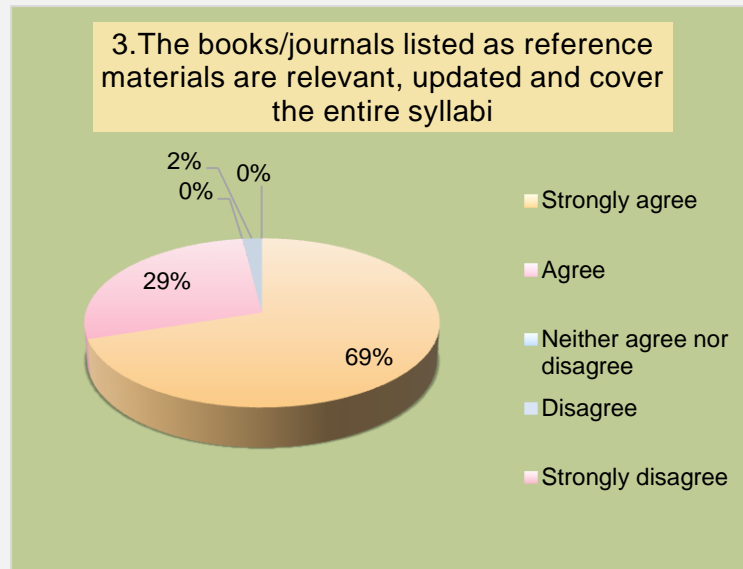




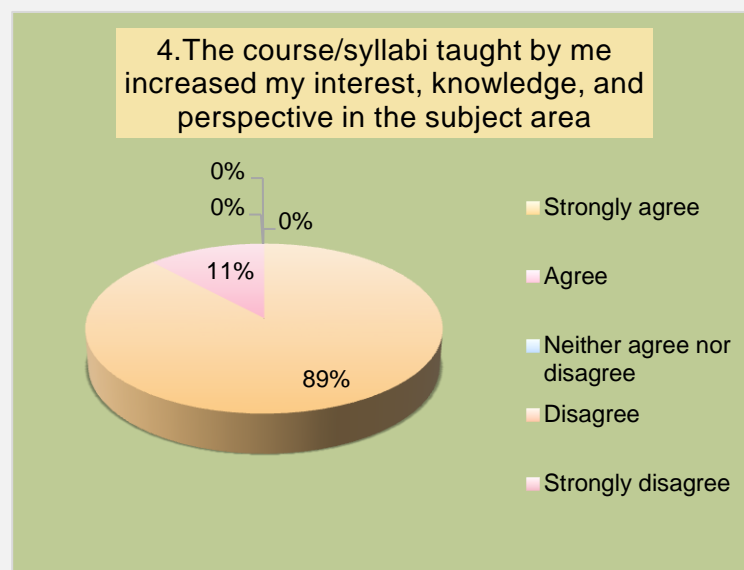
Q.1.According to the above chart, 83 percent of the faculties have strongly agreed that the courses / syllabi they teach have a good balance of theory and application. Only 17% agreed with this metric



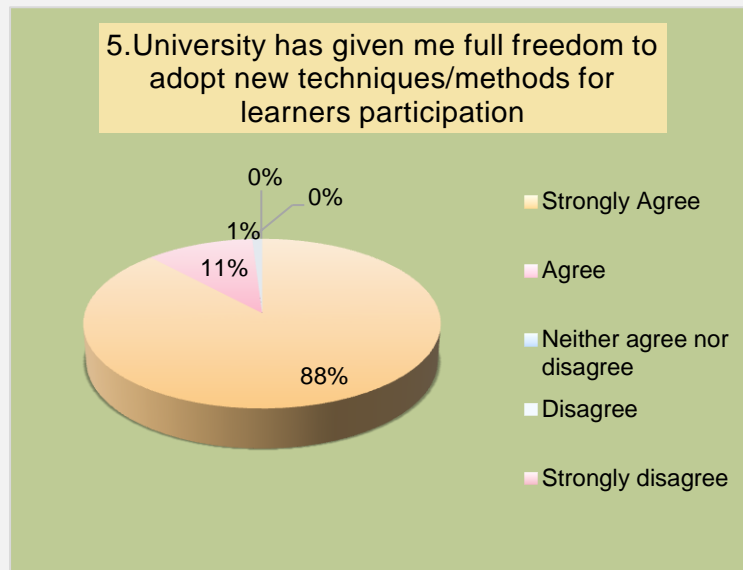
Q.2 According to the above chart, 83 percent of faculty members strongly agree that the objectives of the syllabi are well defined. Only 15 percent said they agreed with this metric, and only 2 percent said they strongly disagreed with it.



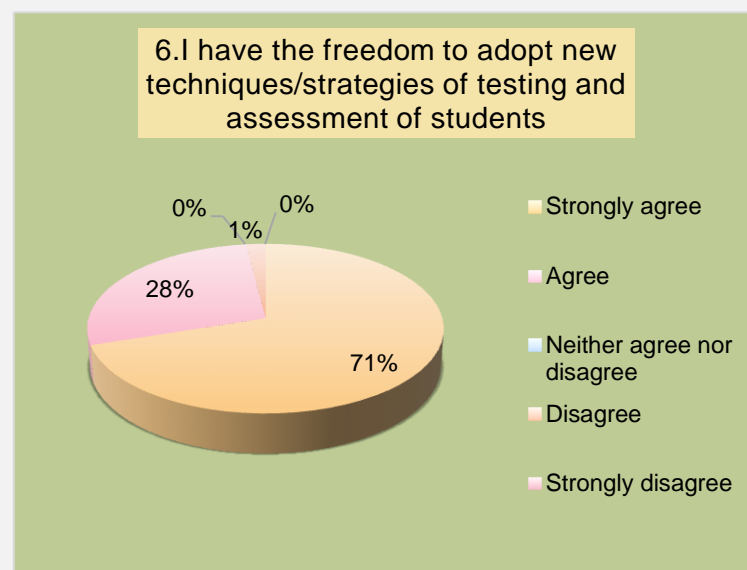
Q.3. According to the above chart, 69% of faculty members strongly agree that the books/journals listed as reference materials are relevant, up to date, and cover the entire syllabi, 29% agree, and 2% neither agree nor disagree.



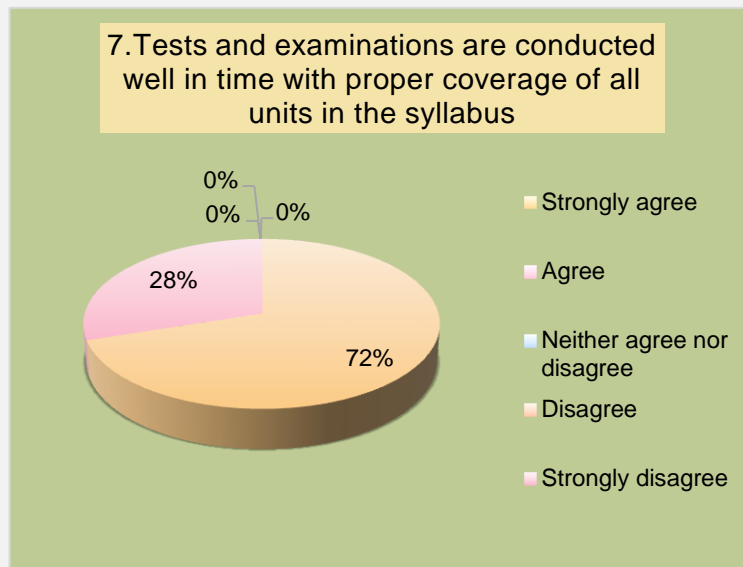
Q.4. According to the above graph, 89 percent of faculty members strongly agree that the course/syllabi taught by me increased my interest, knowledge, and perspective in the subject area, while only 11 percent agreed to this metric.



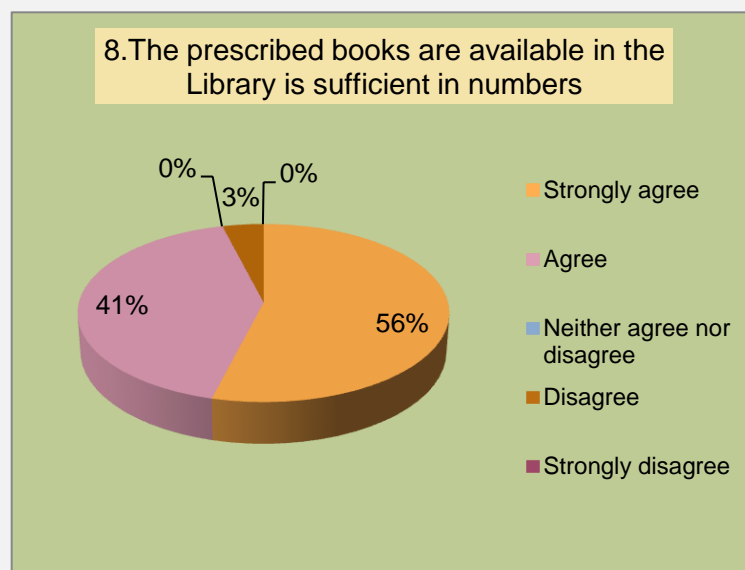
Q.5. According to the above chart, 88 percent of faculty members strongly agree that the university has given them complete freedom to implement new techniques/methods for learner participation, 11 percent agreed to this metric, and only 1 percent said they neither agree nor disagree with the metric.



Q.6. According to the above chart, 71% of faculty members strongly agree that they have the freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of testing and assessing students, 28% agree, and 1% disagree.

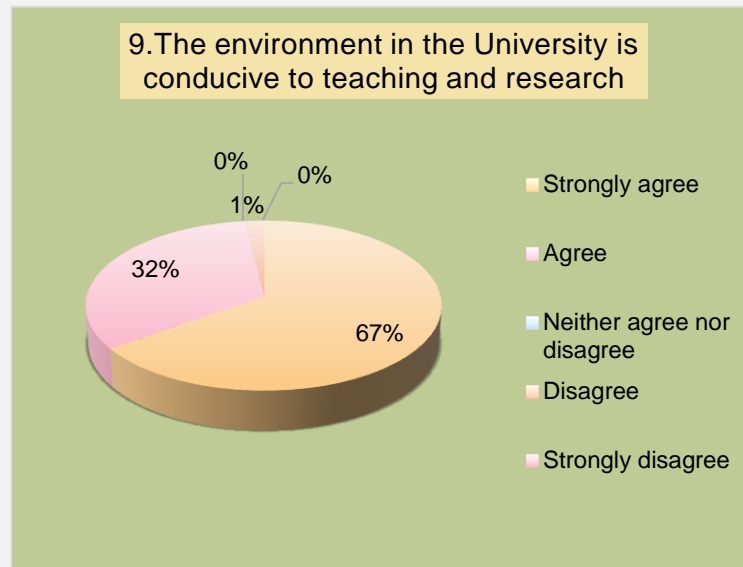

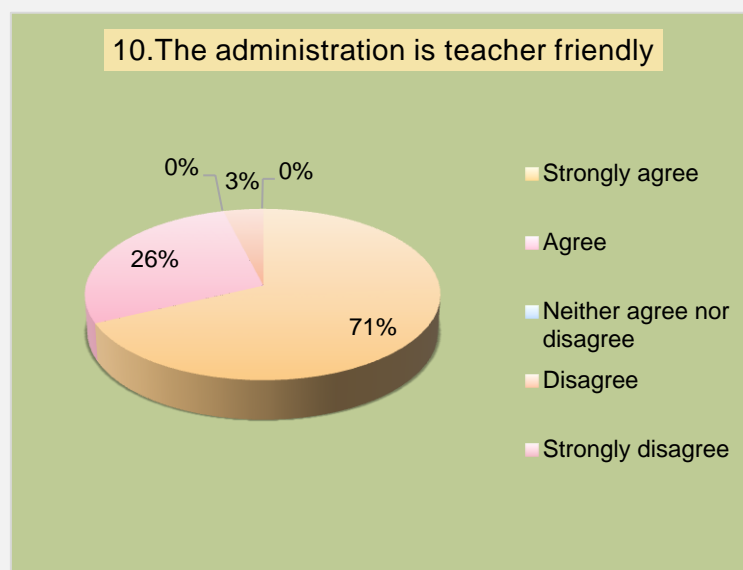

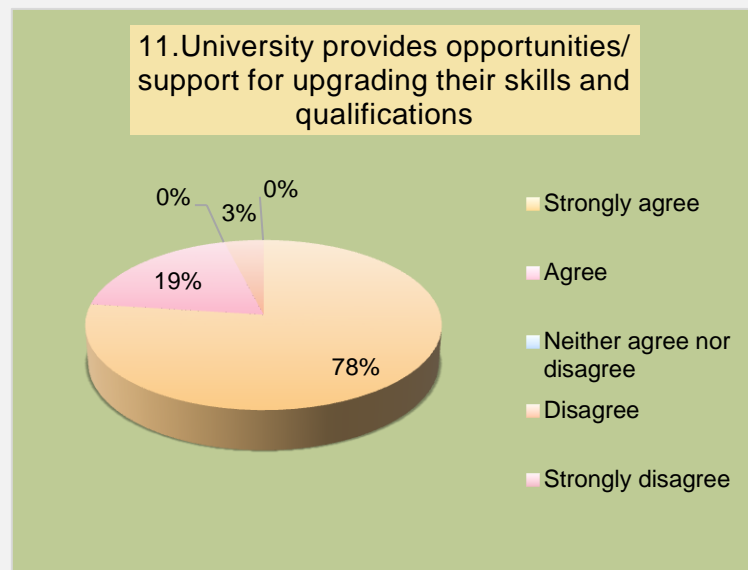




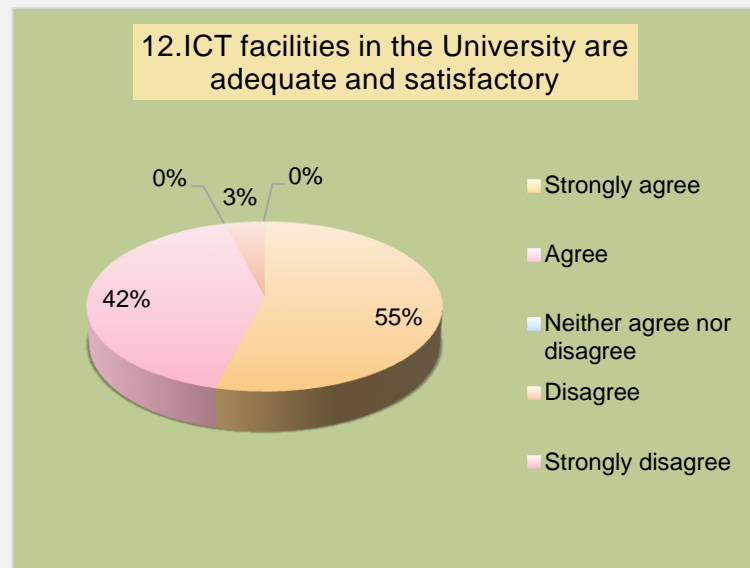

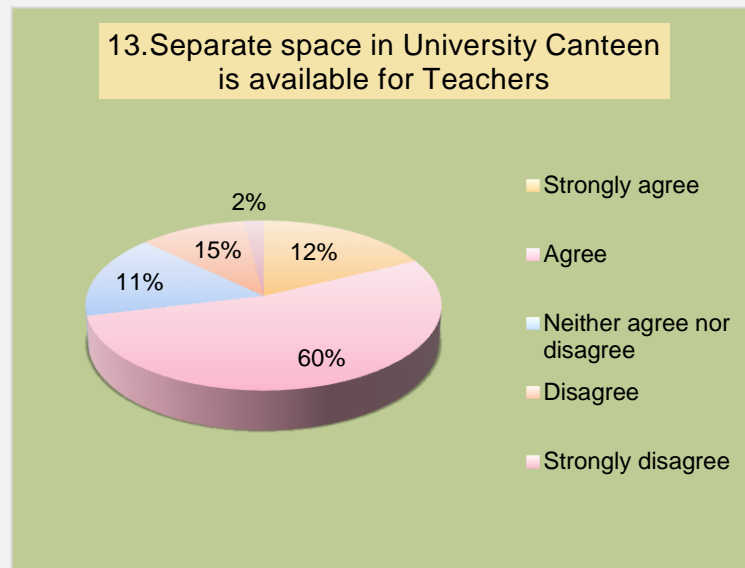
Q.10. According to the above graph, 71 percent of faculty members strongly agree that the administration is teacher friendly, 26 percent agree, and 3 percent disagree.



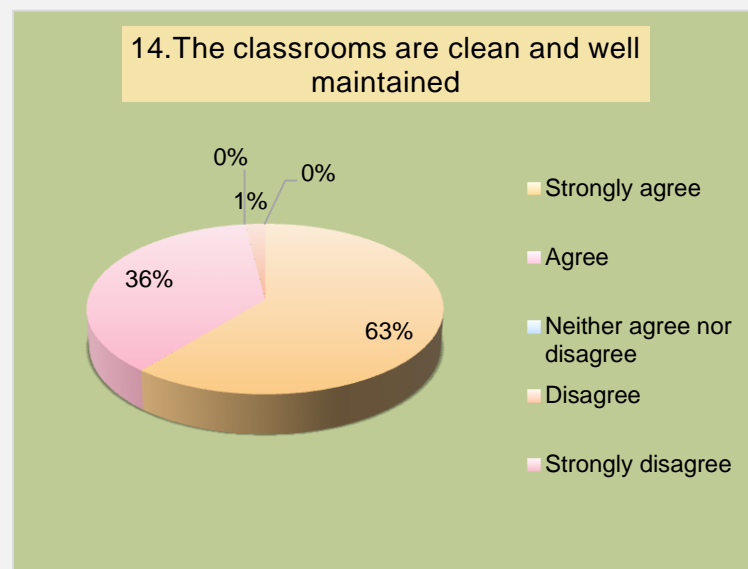

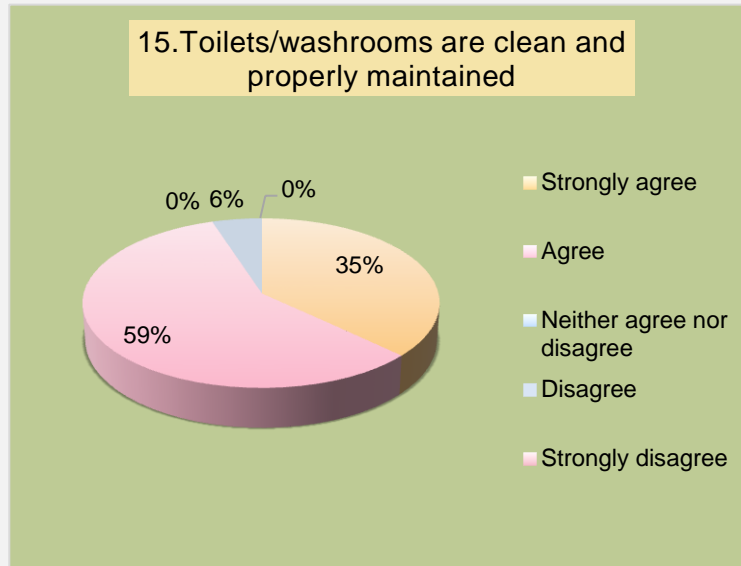

Q.15. According to the above chart, 59 percent of faculty members agreed that toilets/washrooms are clean and properly maintained, 35 percent strongly agreed, and only 6 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.
